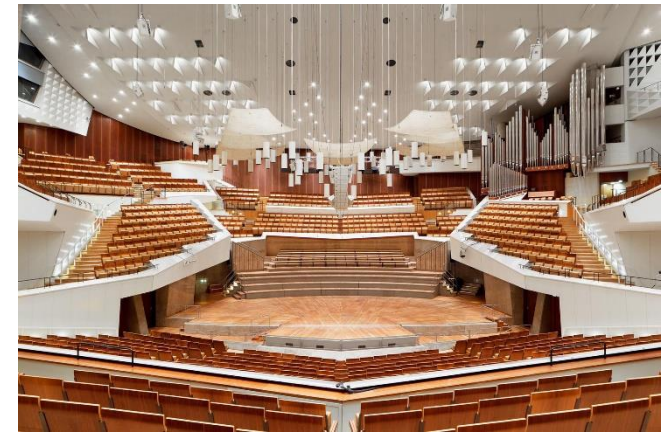

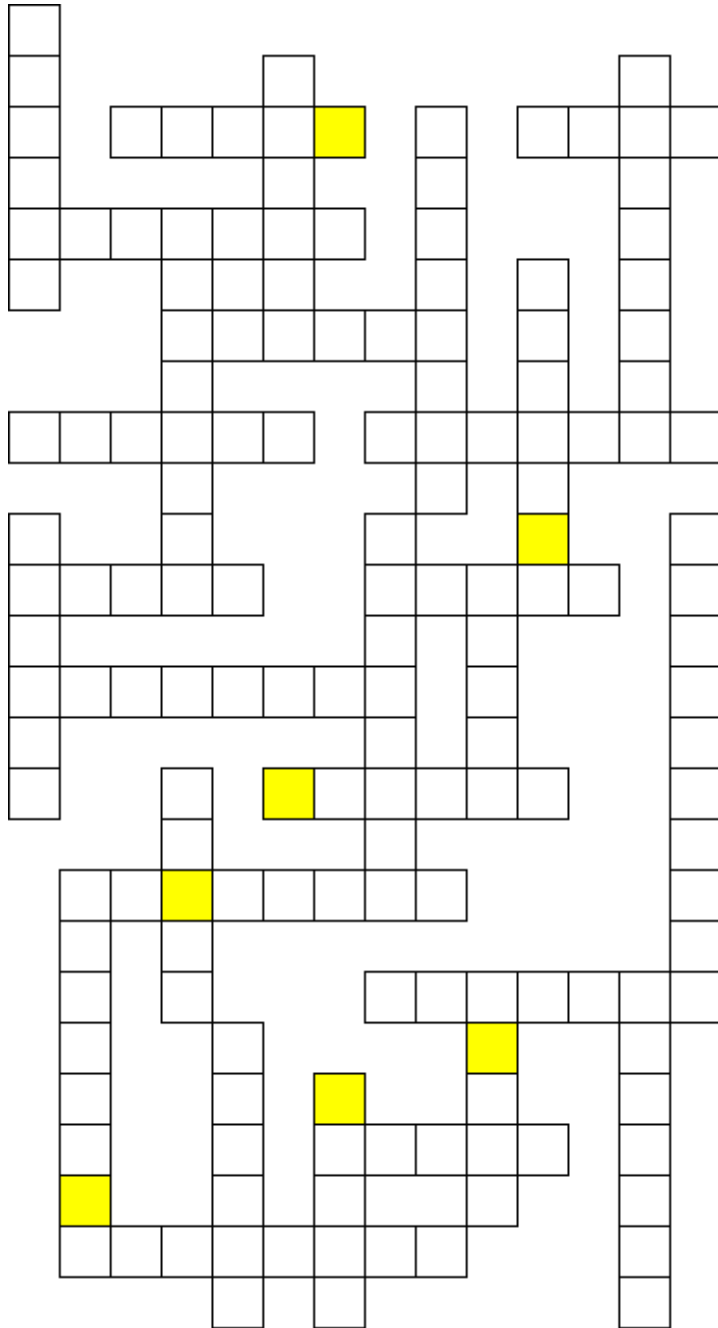

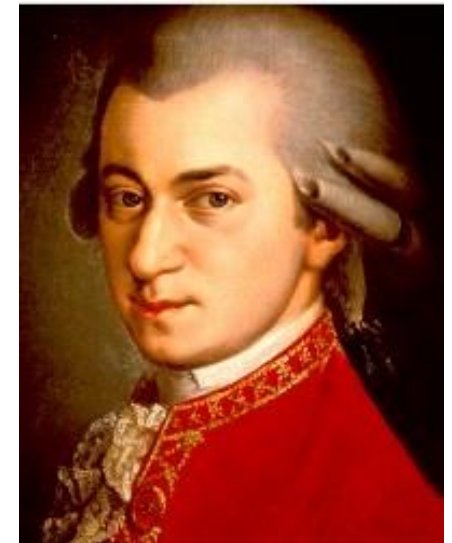

Desert Island Discs

Roy Plomley, then a freelance broadcaster, came up with the idea for Desert Island Discs in 1941. He suggested the idea to the BBC and they agreed.

The first Desert Island Discs programme was recorded in the BBC's bomb-damaged Maida Vale studio on 27th January 1942 and aired in the Forces Programme at 8pm two days later. The people interviewed were asked to choose eight "gramophone records" which they would take with them if they were to be marooned on a desert island.



The programme came off air in 1946 and returned to the Home Service in 1951. In that year, the choice of a luxury item and a book was added, and the actress Sally Ann Howes chose garlic as her luxury! The book would be in addition to a volume of Shakespeare and a Bible, which was assumed to have been deposited there by The Gideon Society.

In 1967, Desert Island Discs moved to Radio 4, and Roy Plomley continued to present the programme until his death, in 1985. He was replaced by Michael Parkinson who presented 96 programmes on between then and 1988. Sue Lawley became the first female presenter and over 8 years, she interviewed 750 people from all aspects of public life including politics, entertainment, science and sport. In August 2006 she was replaced by journalist and broadcaster, Kirsty Young.

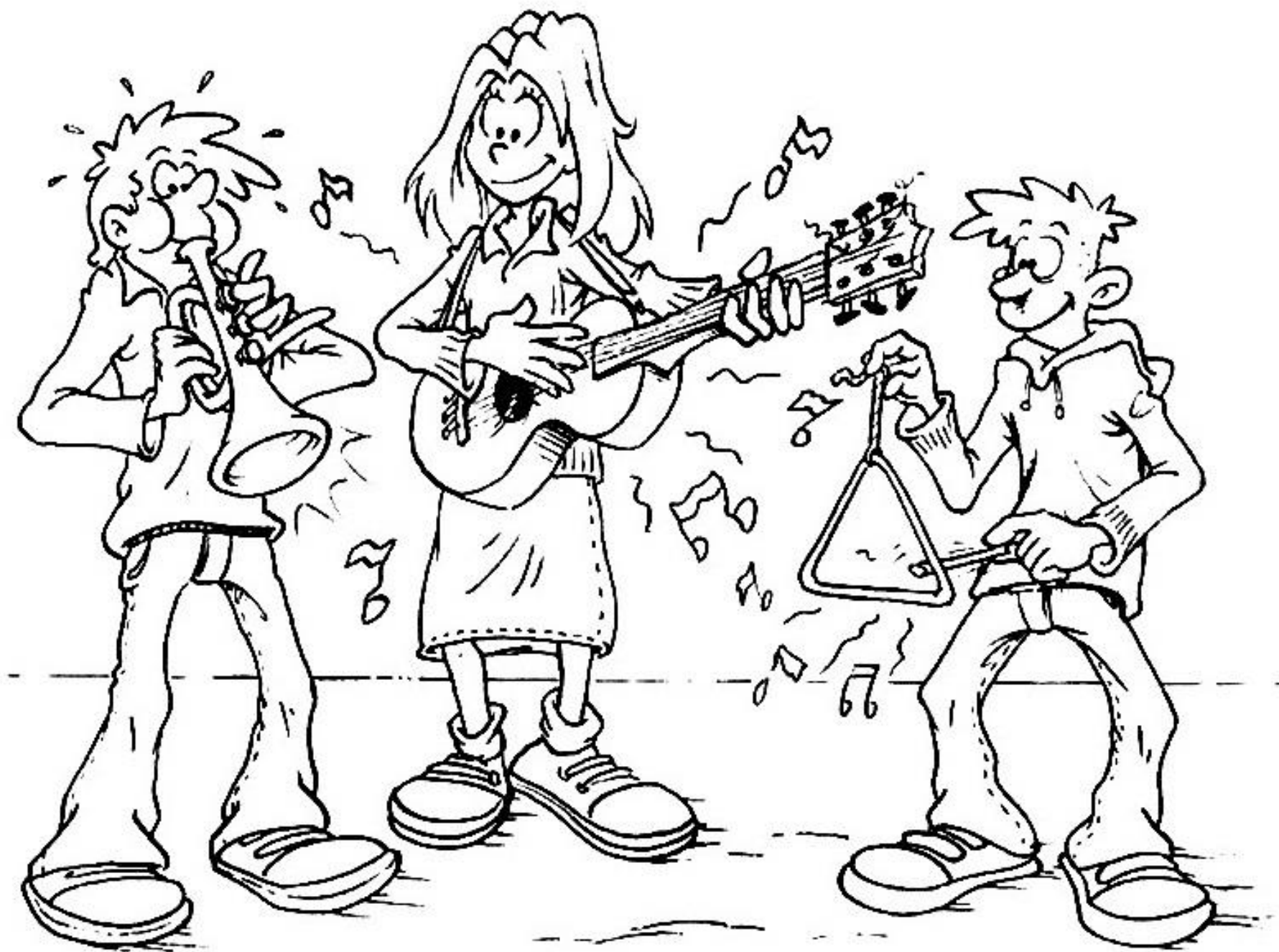

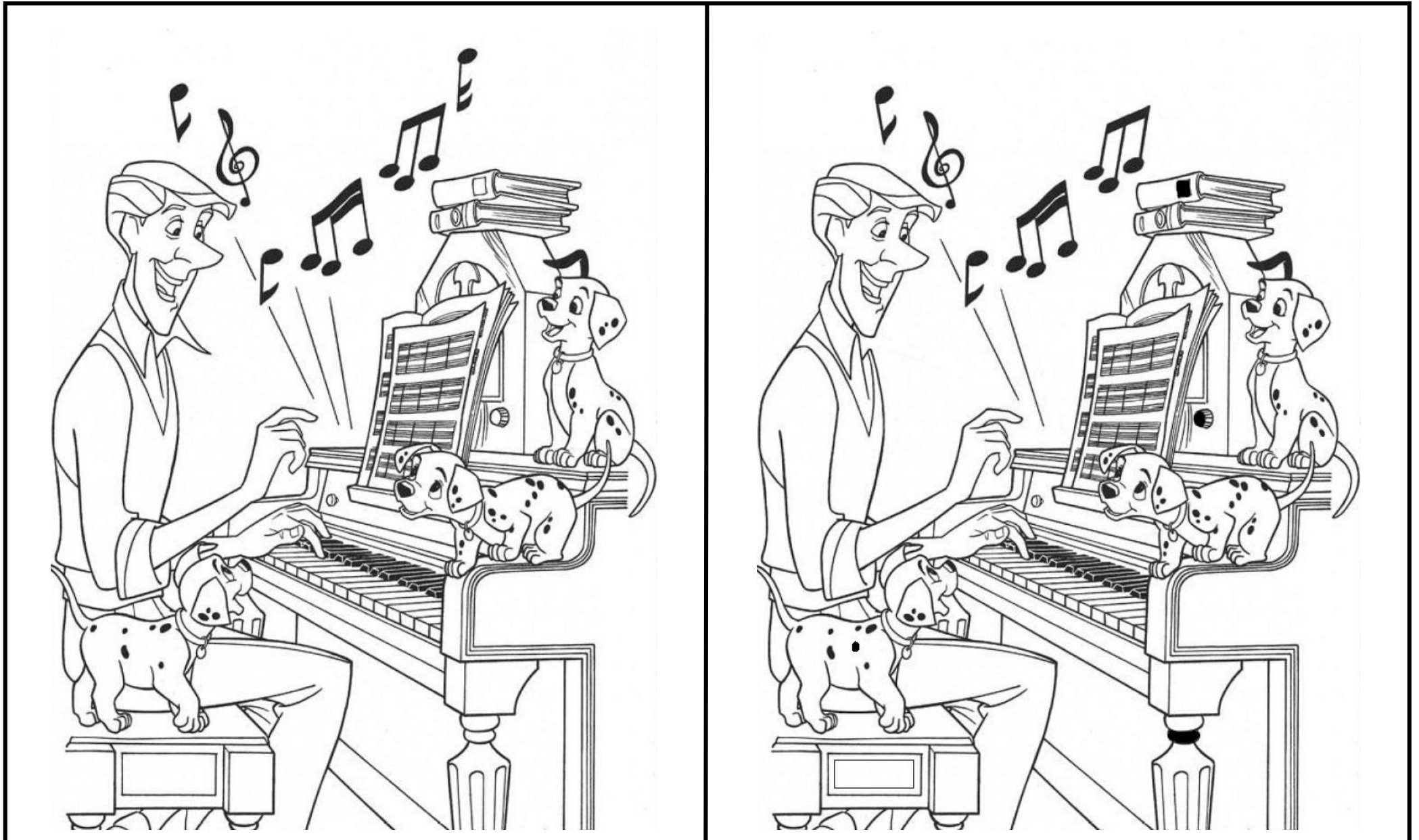
